Message from Our Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Elsewhere in Matthew, Jesus says, "Seek first the kingdom of heaven, and all these other things will be given to you." In today's reading, He tells more parables from ordinary, everyday events in life, which involve persons who search for something valuable. Like King Solomon who sought wisdom, we should seek both it and the understanding needed to appreciate the parables, which serve as symbols of and gateways to the kingdom of God. We can become "scribes of Christ."

EXEGESIS:

Jesus tells more parables which focus on work and money or valuable things. In today's gospel, the person who finds the treasure in the field, the merchant seeking fine pearls, and the fisherman with his net are all engaged in searching. That which they seek is symbolic of the kingdom of God, which is so precious it causes these persons (and us) to take risks (of faith) to find it. But like the fisherman, we have to be prepared to encounter obstacles such as "bad fish," which we can temporarily overcome, realizing that the ultimate separation of the good and the evil will be done at the "end of the age." Thus Jesus elsewhere in Matthew advises his disciples to "Seek first the kingdom of heaven, and all these other things will be given to you." The joy which the parable people experience, and the wisdom which King Solomon seeks, can become ours.

Jesus praises his followers (and us) who understand his parables. They become like the learned scribes of Judaism, who knew how to interpret old beliefs and practices in light of the new, and new ones in light of the old. We then realize that Christ himself becomes the definitive fulfillment and interpreter of the old and new revelations of God.
