Please login to your EIM account (use the Alternate Login option if needed) to pre-register to attend an EIM workshop. Please do not bring children to an EIM workshop. Materials used in the workshop include testimonies from victims and perpetrators of sexual abuse; if you have any concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact Emily Hurlimann at (512) 949-2447 to make an alternative arrangement to receive your training. *Message from Our Pastor*

The doctrine of the Communion of Saints tells us that Christians of the past, present, and even future are interconnected in their spiritual relationship with one another through the redemption of Christ.

EXEGESIS:

Jesus categorizes kinds of persons who are particularly favored in the eyes of God the Father. In general, it is those who are gentle, merciful, peaceful, clean of heart (loyal, dedicated to God--not simply sexual purity), and who will suffer ridicule or injustice for their love of God's kingdom (the last Beatitude reflects the persecution of the early Christians when Matthew is writing this). These are virtues usually at odds against secular society today. Therefore, by implication, we Christians should treat others with mercy, respect, etc.

Speaking of persecution: The highly dramatic First Reading from Revelations summarizes the purpose of that book. Revelations (Apocalypse) is not primarily a book of prophecies about the end of the world, as fundamentalist Protestants present it. It is primarily John's letter of encouragement and hope written to his fellow Christians who are being persecuted by the Romans in the first century throughout the Roman Empire.
