Three DVD talks with Jeff Cavins and group discussion will be covered each 1st Saturday from 8:30 - 1:30. Spend just one morning a month to learn what the New Testament Gospel Matthew has to say to us. Witness for yourself how Jesus demonstrates His authority and Divinity through his miraculous ministry and recognize the power and importance of The Church, the Mass and the Sacraments established by Christ.

EVERY MONDAY FOR ACTS: THE SPREAD OF THE KINGDOM Beginning September 8th from 8:30-10:30 for 24 weeks we will dive into the Book of Acts. If you wanted to learn more about the Holy Spirit and how Christ's Kingdom on earth is empowered to carry out his work in this world, this study if for you. The Book of Acts shows the Church, enlivened by the Holy Spirit, teaching, preaching, healing and restoring outcasts in the same way that Jesus did on earth. The Acts of the Apostles provides an historic framework for understanding the rest of the New Testament. Paul's letters in particular come alive in a new way when they are read within the context of the Acts Narrative.

### Message from Our Pastor

#### Dear Parish Family,

The Church today (the apostles in the boat) is still threatened today by storms (secularism, atheism, persecution, etc.). Jesus still makes his appearance in mystical and sacramental ways to save the Church and to encourage faith in Him. The task of Peter (the popes) in heading the boat (the laity) and the apostles (bishops and priests) is still a great challenge. But fear and lack of trust in Christ should not overwhelm us in our own spiritual lives.

#### **EXEGESIS:**

Jesus again engages in private prayer in the evening. Meanwhile, his apostles are caught in a Sea of Galilee storm in the early morning. The sea (really a lake) is shallow, so storms often erupted unexpectedly. Jesus then approaches the apostles' boats by walking on water toward them. The frightened Peter leaves the boat to try himself to walk on water and begins to sink before Jesus saves him.

This gospel reading has elements of the Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension events and the other story of Jesus' calming of the lake storm--with focus on Peter as the chief apostle. "It's a ghost!" the apostles shout, the same cry they have in another gospel story in which they see the resurrected Jesus on the lakeshore. Jesus tells them not to fear, just as the angels at Jesus' Easter tomb constantly tried to calm the women there. As the frightened Peter had denied knowing Jesus on Good Friday, here he still doubts or denies it is the Lord {"If it is you, command me to come to you"), even though Jesus has just told him (and the others) that it is certainly He walking on water.

There is no physical reason why Peter would want to leave the boat to try to reach Jesus. So it is his personality, characterized by spontaneity and strong love for the Lord, which motivates him here. Jesus appreciates Peter's faith but also knows that Peter, as he did before, will temporarily fail to trust strongly enough in Him. Jesus' saving of Peter from drowning symbolizes his ultimate forgiveness of Peter's denials of Him.

Sea storms in Jewish thought always represented moral evil. Thus Jesus here represents the power of God in controlling suffering and evil, and his saving of Peter symbolizes his saving of all believers. In the older version of this story (in Mark), the event ends with the apostles simply expressing awe and confusion. But in this later version by Matthew, the apostles express full faith in Jesus as Son of God, indicating the growth of faith by the early Christians when the gospels are being written. Moreover, when Jesus says to Peter, "Why did you doubt?", the particular verb for "doubt" is found only again at the Ascension where Matthew says the apostles both believed and doubted in the ascending Christ. This symbolizes the struggle among the early Christians in clarifying their faith in the human-divine Jesus who had lived among them.
