Message from Our Pastor

In today's gospel, Jesus uses one of his several parables dealing with the use and misuse of money and material goods to illustrate how his followers must be faithful, confident, and disciplined in their practice of their faith.

EXEGESIS:

Several of Jesus' parables deal with the use of money in a secular setting which is not specifically religious; this is one of them. However, the religious meaning behind the parable is of value for his disciples and for us Christians. Interestingly, even though the first two servants double the money of their master, the master considers these accomplishments to be "small matters." But the "faithfulness" and savvy of the servants are rewarded by giving them greater responsibilities. The third servant, motivated by lack of confidence or fear of his master, simply buries his share of the money, which, of course, does not earn profit. That servant is called "wicked and lazy" by the master and is severely punished by the master. That servant is prevented from "sharing the master's joy" (a reference to an appreciation banquet).

Jesus is telling his followers that they cannot be lax in their faith, nor can they be driven by fear of the world. If they know their master (Jesus), they know that He himself is committed, fair, hopeful, and future-oriented, and they know they must imitate Him. It is the dedicated disciples of Christ who ultimately will feast with Him at the great heavenly banquet at the end of time.
