Please login to your EIM account (use the Alternate Login option if needed) to pre-register to attend an EIM workshop. Please do not bring children to an EIM workshop. Materials used in the workshop include testimonies from victims and perpetrators of sexual abuse; if you have any concerns regarding your attendance at a workshop, please contact Emily Hurlimann at [\(512\) 949-2447](tel:5129492447) to make an alternative arrangement to receive your training. The Czechs who settled the Granger community began arriving in 1881. Some of their names, Bartos, Cervenka, Pecka, Prikryl, Tobolka, Krkoska, Kopecky, Kaderka, Jurecka, David, Janak, Kalinec, Zrubek, Struhel, Mazac, Nemec, Rychlik, (now Anglicized) still resound in the area today. They came armed with a work ethic, a proud heritage and an abiding faith in God. The nurturance of this faith was apparently a top priority because despite their harsh, toil-laden lives, these pioneers sought a place of worship. The nearest Catholic church was in Taylor, Texas, 12 miles away, which, most of the time, entailed an overnight excursion to attend services. Infrequently, the priest from Taylor would venture forth to offer Mass in Granger in the Struhel home. However, it was soon evident that this arrangement did not satisfy the spiritual needs of this small Czech community. (2)
